Our Association is a New Zealand legal entity which has functioned as an incorporated society since September 2000, registration number 1071174.

In June 2010, the Association has been registered as a charity with the Charities Commission, registration number CC44342.

Our Purpose

- To benefit the Romanian community by promoting Romanian history, culture, and language within Auckland and wider New Zealand.
- To promote the Romanian language and cultural and spiritual traditions through education to both members and non-members.
- To foster mutual respect and assistance among members; to support and assist new Romanian immigrants in successfully integrating into New Zealand society.
- To provide key contacts of Auckland-based Romanians to people throughout New Zealand or to organizations within New Zealand or from overseas.
- To enhance the image of Romania and Romanians in New Zealand.
- To strengthen ties between Aucklanders of Romanian origin and the general public through meetings, cultural and artistic activities, sports competitions, and any other suitable activities.

This year 262 members have paid their membership fee. The beneficiaries of the Association activities are much more, approximate 550 within the Romanian Community of approximate 1,500 in Auckland.

Funding

- Our Association acquires financial support from New Zealand in the form of grants.
- The remaining portion of our revenue is generated through the proceeds of our activities, membership fees, and donations.
- Our annual membership fee stands at \$10, while senior members and students over 18 are eligible for a reduced fee of \$5.

Radio "Românie, Plai de Dor"

For more than 22 years, every Friday evening, from 8:30 PM to 9:30 PM, the radio team greets the Romanian community in the sweet Romanian language on 104.6FM, during the show "Românie, Plai de Dor".

The radio group has recently relocated to a new home at 875 New North Road. This modern and beautiful space features multiple recording and broadcasting booths, along with hot desk areas where hosts can prepare their shows, create quality recordings and podcasts, and meet with other show hosts

The new facilities also provide an inviting environment for warmly welcoming guests. Visitors are encouraged to stop by, especially on Friday evenings, when the long-running show 'Romanie, Plai de Dor" is broadcast. This program has been a staple for almost 25 years.

The team lineup includes Camelia Petrus, who hosts on the second Friday of each month, Calin Rosu on the third Friday, Manuela Hrib on the fourth Friday, and Cristi Dumitrache and Lucia Davis on the first Friday of each month. On the rare fifth Fridays, all hostsjoin together for a live broadcast.

New volunteers are welcomed with enthusiasm and joy; the team provides training and mentoring for those interested in learning about radio, podcasting, and media.

Additionally, the show 'Romanie, Plai de Dor" is now available on Spotify, expanding its accessibility to a broader audience. The media landscape is rapidly evolving, presenting both significant challenges and fantastic opportunities. Transitioning from traditional FM radio, the group is embracing the new, continually developing world of modern media. As members of PlanetFM, they have the opportunity to diversify their message to the world using contemporary spaces, technologies, and platforms.

The radio team and PlanetFM offer support for any ideas and projects that individuals wish to develop in this new media environment.



Indoor Soccer

The group meets every Tuesday evening at 7:30 PM at 37 Sunrise Avenue, Murrays Bay, Auckland, 0630.

The group's primary activity is a weekly indoor soccer game held every Tuesday evening at 7:30 PM at Murrays Bay Intermediate School. This tradition has been ongoing for approximately 20 years. In addition to the weekly matches, the group participates in an annual competition each February on Waiheke Island.

The number of participants remains fairly consistent, typically ranging between 14 and 20 people.

Funding for this activity is as follows:

- The activity is financed by the participants. The annual cost of the hall is \$3000. Eighteen participants contribute through an automatic payment of \$5 per week, while a smaller number pay \$10 per session without automatic payment. Participation is free for younger members who are still in school or are students.
- Two years ago, we received funding from the Doina Association, which covered the hall costs for one year. We hope to receive similar support this year to help maintain the current expenses for participants.



'Doina' - Folk Dance Group

Doina Group consists of a handful of Romanian women eager to preserve the traditions from home. The group meets every Friday evening at the Ponsonby Community Centre for rehearsals and frequently participates in multicultural festivals in Auckland and beyond.

Approximately 12 years ago, Mihaela Enache attended a multicultural show in Auckland and was fascinated by Bulgarian folk dances. Shortly after, in 2013, the Doina folk dance group was born.

Composed of a handful of Romanian women eager to maintain their homeland's traditions, the group met weekly for rehearsals, supported by the Doina Association. The Doina dancers made it a tradition to participate in multicultural dance festivals, culminating in a trip to Melbourne in 2018. There, they were invited to be part of a show held on the occasion of Romania Day. The girls were a huge success and promised to continue the tradition.

The group has also participated in most of the fundraisers organized by the association over the years. The Romanian women still meet almost weekly at the Ponsonby Community Centre during school terms.

The group mainly consists of mothers and daughters, and they recently received brand -new traditional costumes from Romania with the support of the Doina Association.

Children eager to join can do so from the age of 5. Recently, two 7-year-old girls, along with their mothers, have started attending rehearsals. The group strives to include a dance from each region of Romania.



"Ia La Antipozi" - Romanian Folk Blouses Sewing Group

The "Ia la Antipozi" group meets every two weeks at the Ponsonby Community Centre. In this group, members study and work on Romanian blouses or shirts.

"la La Antipozi" is a group born from the meeting of two traditional Romanian blouses: a heritage blouse from Arges, part of Mihaela Enache's PhD project, and Adina Costache's blouse, inherited from her mother.

The group's passion for Romanian traditional attire is shared by all members. They study and create traditional Romanian blouses and shirts, noting that not all traditional shirts are "ii"; only those gathered at the neck are called "ii.

"The "ia cu altiță" blouse was recently recognized by UNESCO as a cultural treasure. This garment is a symbol of Romanian village values and creativity.

The group draws inspiration from books, old shirts, sewing techniques on YouTube, and exhibitions in Romania. They also follow Romanian groups dedicated to this art, like "Semne Cusute," "Ia Râurată Românește," and "MăiestrlA."

Currently, the group has 11 active members and welcomes new ones who want to sew their own shirts. They use old patterns, notably from the album of Elisa I. Brătianu. The traditional Romanian " ia" has regained attention from researchers and the public, partly due to its popularity with fashion houses like Yves Saint Laurent and Tom Ford. The focus is on traditional blouses made in villages before the communist era, not mass -produced ones from India or China.



"La povești în Limba Română (Telling Stories in Romanian)" Children's Play Group

The group meets on the second Sunday of each month at Takapuna Playcentre, 4/8 Auburn Street, Auburn Reserve, Takapuna, Auckland.

At the end of 2017, our community formed a group for families with young children called "La povești în Limba Română (Telling Stories in Romanian)" .

It began on the Doina Association's Facebook page, where we discussed helping our children learn Romanian amidst an English-speaking environment. We concluded that children learn best from other children through play, songs, and stories in Romanian. So, we decided to meet regularly.

Initially, around 40 members joined (now we are 125), and we found the perfect location at Takapuna $\;$ Playcentre. We decided to meet monthly on the second Sunday.

Over these six years, we've had many wonderful meetings filled with games and stories. Some children have grown up and left, and some families have moved away, but new families constantly join us, and we enjoy every meeting.

Notable events include Martisor, Dragobete, Easter, Children's Day, and meeting Santa Claus. Occasionally, we have guests like the senior group, young Romanian women like Bianca (who teaches jewelry making), Calina (who teaches sewing), and Irina (who teaches dance). Sometimes, we go on trips to places like the Zoo, Goat Island, or the Winter Garden in Auckland Domain.



Romanian Library and "Cafeneaua Literara" (Literary Café)

The Romanian Library is open on the third Sunday of each month from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM at Ponsonby Community Centre.

The Romanian Library and Literary Café is open on the third Sunday of each month from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM at Ponsonby Community Centre.

This event is designed to be more than a library for borrowing and returning Romanian books; it serves as a monthly social gathering for community members to meet, socialize, and form friendships.

Tea, coffee, and snacks are provided, encouraging attendees to bring good cheer and engage in pleasant conversations. Bringing a snack or dessert to share is optional.

There is an opportunity for participants to set up small stands to sell handmade products, with prior arrangement.

This initiative aims to foster community connections and enrich the cultural fabric of the community.



Doina - The Seniors Group

The group organizes 3-4 trips annually, where members share memories, jokes, music, and traditional Romanian dishes.

Coordinators: Andu Iordache, Irina Adamovics and Cristina Lapusan

Over 11 years ago, Andu Iordache and Edi Popescu founded the Seniors' Club to connect Romanian seniors in New Zealand. The club's main goal is to help elderly members interact and explore various places together. Studies suggest that an active lifestyle can delay dementia and Alzheimer's. This includes regular exercise, social activities, mental stimulation, and a balanced diet.

Each year, the Club organizes trips with new destinations, where seniors share memories, jokes, music, and traditional Romanian dishes. Before COVID-19, the Club held an annual party for the Romanian community, raising funds for future activities. The Doina Association and community members have generously supported these events over the years.



Magura - Theatre Group

The Magura Group gathers each year to select, rehearse, and perform a play, delighting audiences from September to November.

Coordinator: Delia Giurgiu

In 2013, Adina Giurgiu invited renowned Romanian actor Claudiu Bleont and writer GeorgeSmarandache to Auckland to stage the play Măgura." Bleont directed, designed, and acted in the play, involving local Romanians who worked evenings after their jobs. Initially, two performances were planned, but due to high demand, a third was added. After Bleont's departure, the participants wanted to continue their theater journey.

Delia initiated the formation of the amateur acting troupe "Măgura" in Auckland. Over the years, new members joined, and they delighted the community annually with Romanian plays, gaining recognition through radio and TV interviews.

The troupe's activities are supported by the Doina Association and the Romanian community. Ticket sales partially cover expenses, with the rest funded by grants. All members volunteer without payment, rewarded by audience applause and support.

The Măgura troupe welcomes anyone interested in joining as actors, directors, or helpers.



"Tabara Romaneasca" - The Romanian Camp

The Romanian Camp is one of the oldest and most cherished traditions. With 16 successful camps, it stands as one of the largest and most logistically impressive projects, filled with enthusiasm and dedication year after year.

The "Romanian Camp" project, conceived and executed by Adina Giurgiu, was supported by her family, volunteers, and parents of participating children. The idea was born in 2007 and first materialized in January 2008. The camp is a heartfelt project, requiring love, dedication, and sincerity to work with children.

As far as we know, this project is unique, with no other Romanian community in the diaspora having a similar initiative. We aimed to create a camp for Romanian children in Auckland, where they could speak Romanian, sing Romanian songs, listen to Romanian stories and legends, watch children's movies in Romanian in the evenings, play traditional Romanian games, and eat traditional Romanian food.

Parents and grandparents gladly participated as volunteer instructors, each taking care of a certain number of children according to their ages. Over the years, we have successfully organized 16 camps.



"Am plecat să colindăm" - Carols Singing Group

Each year, a dedicated group of 15-20 carolers spends 34 days traveling across Auckland, joyfully bringing Romanian songs and traditions to community members.

The caroling group "Amplecat să colindăm" was formed in 2013 by Irina Pegler. Irina and the Doina folk dance group surprised her parents with carols to ease their homesickness and bring a piece of Romanian Christmas traditions. This special evening turned into an annual tradition, and they have been caroling from house to house ever since, depending on requests and available voices.

Each year, they rely on 1520 carolers and spend 3-4 days covering all parts of Auckland, sometimes even reaching Tauranga. New members and vocal talents are always welcome. Equipped with guitars, a ukulele, drums, jingle bells, and lots of cheer, they bring the joy of Christmas to Romanian homes.

The effort is significant, especially given how busy the roads in Auckland are during the week leading up to Christmas, but the satisfaction is immense.

For the first time this year, the Doina association also organized a carol singing event at Ponsonby Community Centre, where people brought food and sang together with the group. We intend to make this a permanent event in our yearly calendar.



The "Păturici pentru cei mici" project focuses on donating handmade items created by our community members to hospitals, maternity units, charitable organizations, and other places in need of a little help.

Coordinator: Calina Wise

The "Păturici pentru cei mici" project began in 2019, aiming to donate handmade items from our community members to hospitals, maternity units, and charities.

Project Highlights

- •Origins: Started in response to Middlemore Hospital's call for clothes for premature and newborn babies.
- •Growth: Over 30 volunteers have contributed, donating over 100 blankets and approximately 300 clothing items.
- •Sustainable Efforts: Since 2020, we've donated cloth bags for Nurturing Families to distribute toiletries.
- •Beneficiaries: Donations have been made to Middlemore Hospital, Waitakere Hospital, Beanies for Babies, Nurturing Families, and Care 4 Kidz.
- •Community: Our meetings foster friendships, exchange patterns, and teach new knitting and crocheting techniques.

The project continues to provide warmth and comfort to those in need while strengthening our community.











Doina Association Folk Costumes Rental

These beautiful costumes are available for any cultural event, ensuring the preservation and celebration of Romanian traditions within our community.

In the early 2000s, Doina Association, under the leadership of then-president Constantin Roşu (Pucu), received a small donation of national costumes for children and adults from the 'Muzeul Țăranului Român" (The National Museum of the Romanian Peasant).

Over the years, additional blouses (ii) and various clothing items have been added, resulting in a collection of costumes available for rent at very affordable prices.

The costumes are now managed by Adina Giurgiu. The rental and storage of these costumes are volunteer activities, with all proceeds used to organize various community activities.

These beautiful costumes are available for any cultural event, ensuring the preservation and celebration of Romanian traditions within our community.

10 September 2023 - Father's Day Activity organized by the group "La Povești în limba română" Coordinator: Ada Radoslav





Notes to the Financial Statements

Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Reporting entity

- Doina Community of Romanian Aucklanders Inc. is a charitable organisation, based in Auckland.
- It is a New Zealand legal entity which has functioned as an incorporated society since September 2000, registration number 1071174.
- In June 2010, the Association has been registered as a charity with the Charities Commission, registration number CC44342.

(b) Date of authorisation

- The Activity Report and summary of the Income Statement and Balance Sheet Report has been presented at the Annual General Meeting of the Association on 19 May 2024.
- The Annual Return will be authorised for issue by the Management Committee.

(c) Statement of compliance and basis of operation

- The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in New Zealand (NZ GAAP). They comply with New Zealand equivalents to IFRSs (NZ IFRSs) and other applicable Financial Reporting Standards, as appropriate for public benefit entities that qualify for, and apply, differential reporting concessions.
- The Association is a public benefit entity. The Association qualifies for differential reporting concessions as it does not have public accountability and it is not large.
- The financial statements are presented in New Zealand Dollars (NZD) rounded to the nearest dollar.
- The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis.

(d) Goods and services tax

 The Association is not GST registered and all items of the Income Statement and Balance Sheet are inclusive of GST.

(e) Volunteer services and other donated goods and services

- No value has been placed on the time provided by volunteers.

(f) Income tax

- Being a charitable organisation registered with the Charities Commission the Association is exempted from paying Income tax.

(a) Audit

- These financial statements have not been audited.
- There is no statutory requirement for audited financial statements.

(h) Revenue recognition

- The membership fee is collected for the year ending March and coincides with the financial year of the Association.
- The grants are recognised in full as revenue in the financial year they are actually paid to the
- Association.
- Historically the New Zealand grants have been received in March April and August September, in advance for activities spanning in the following year.

Note 1 - Membership fee

The current annual fee is set at \$10 with a discounted fee of \$5 for senior members and students over

18 years old. This year 219 members have paid their membership fee.

The beneficiaries of the Association activities are much more, approximate 550 within the Romanian Community of approximate 1,500 in Auckland.

Note 2 - Grants from New Zealand

Grants received from New Zealand Government departments include NZ Lottery, Auckland local Community Organisation Grants Schemes (COGS), Ethnic Communities, North Foundation and Creative Communities grants.

Note 3 - Grants from Romania

Currently we don't receive grants from Romania

Note 4 – Activities income

Most of the Association activities are subject to an entry/attendance fee with the purpose of partially covering the cost of the activity and fund raising for future activities.

Note 5- Donations

The Association is a Donee organisation, and the donors can claim a tax credit for donations of money of \$5 or more.

Note 6 – Volunteers expenses

Volunteer costs relate to gift vouchers (food) and petrol reimbursement.

Note 7 – Administration expenses

Administration expenses relate to guests, committee and members meetings, venues hire, subscription for the accounting package, software licences, storage, postage, other fees.

Note 8 - Cash

Cash comprises cash balances and savings deposits immediately available.

Note 9 – Debtors, prepayments.

Trade and other receivables are recognised at fair value.

Note 10 - Accounts Receivable

These are membership fees paid in advance. This was changed from last year's Prepayments Received Account.

Note 11 - Fixed Assets

The Fixed Assets are recognised at cost and the election is not to depreciate them unless they have been permanently impaired, in which case they are completely written off and a relevant depreciation expense is acknowledged.

Note 12 - Suppliers

Trade and other payables are recognised at fair value.

Note 13 – Prepayments received.

Prepayments relate to membership fees paid in advance for year ended March 2024.
